Probolsky Research is a Latina- and woman-owned market and opinion research firm with corporate, election, government, and non-profit clients.

Sample

The sample was compiled from data obtained from the County of Santa Clara Clerk-Recorder and the San Mateo County Assessor. We called, emailed, and texted voters. We matched the demographics of California's 16th Congressional District likely Primary Election voters.

Data Collection Explained

Interviews were conducted by phone (33%) and online (67%) modes. Phone interviews were conducted via landline (34%) or mobile (66%). Online participants were invited by email (50%) and text message (50%) for the online method.

Respondents in all modes chose their preferred language, Chinese (1%), English (95%), Spanish (3%), and Vietnamese (1%).


The online survey was accessible by computer, tablet, and smart phone.

Security measures precluded individuals from completing the survey more than once.





Respondent demographics by gender, age group, ethnicity, city, party preference, vote propensity, and home type






Turnout Model Explained: Likely 2024 Primary voter =

voted 3/20 PLUS registered 3/4/20 or later and voted in all three 11/20, 6/22, and 11/22 (49%)


A third of likely Primary Election voters are unsure, Sam Liccardo leads the race, Joe Simitian close behind in the race for California's 16th Congressional District


Voters say protecting women's right to choose, healthcare affordability, and gun violence should be top priorities

All Bay Area U.S. Representatives have high awareness and favorability levels among likely Primary Election voters




Aware Favorable Unfavorable













